PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

The following amendments to the APMS Bylaws have been suggested and approved by the Board of Directors. They are presented here for each members' consideration. These items will be voted on by the Society at the Nineteenth Annual Meeting, Chattanooga, Tennessee, July 15-18, 1979.

1. AMENDMENT: Under Bylaws Article III, Section B, change the second sentence to read:

"He shall maintain and exercise general supervision over the affairs of the Society, subject to the authority of the Board of Directors, may sign checks in payment of obligations of this Society during the absence or incapacitation of the Treasurer, and shall discharge such other duties as usually pertain to the office of the President."

2. AMENDMENT: Redefine the duties of the nominating committee under Article XII (5) to read as follows:

"The nominating committee shall consist of not less than five (5) members; -preferable -not-less than -one be chaired by the immediate past president, who and shall recommend to the Society candidates for election to the several offices. Terms of membership in the nominating committee shall be for no more than two successive years and a two-year break shall occur between periods of service as a member."
